# **Degrees Offered**

Students will receive college credits for all course work, including practicum, transferable to any Portland Bible College degree programs. Upon successful completion of the program, students will receive a Certificate of Church Ministry.

### **Practicum**

We believe that one of the strongest ways to gain knowledge is by putting it to practice. Practicums are adviser-directed areas of practical ministry and service opportunities intended to help strengthen and release spiritual gifts in students. ## **Tuition**

Total tuition for the 2019-2020 academic year is \$4,500. A fall tuition payment of \$2,250 must be received no later than August 19, 2019. A Spring tuition payment of \$2,250 must be received no later than January 6, 2020. See chart below for a further breakdown of payments.

## Housing

#### **COMMON QUESTIONS**

### \*\*Can I receive financial aid?

The School of Leadership, an affiliate of PBC, is privately funded and is a non-participating school in federal funding (FAFSA) and therefore does not qualify for tuition-related tax deductions under the current tax code. We do not provide 1098T forms. TFH SL will provide invoices to churches for payment. However, these statements cannot be used for tuition-related tax deductions.

## \*\*Can I transfer my credits to another institution?

Credits earned at TFH SL are fully transferable to Portland Bible College. Transferability to colleges other than PBC is not guaranteed as it is at the discretion of each individual college. However, PBC continues to establish a growing number of formal transfer agreements with fully accredited colleges and universities so that students pursuing educational and career objectives beyond TFH SL will have the advantage of their credits being transferable. Students desiring to transfer their credits to other institutions are responsible for determining the requirements of the institution and program to which they plan to transfer.

# \*\*Do I need a high-school diploma to apply?

Applicants must have a high school diploma or a GED in order to receive credit from TFH SL. If you are currently working on getting your diploma or GED, you may apply and be accepted, but understand that you will not be able to receive college credits until your diploma or GED has been completed and the official documentation has been submitted to TFH SL. Official sealed transcripts (GED, high school or college) must be sent directly from your school to the TFH School of Leadership admissions office as part of the application process.

### \*\*What is the typical age of a SL student?

We accept students between the ages of 18-35. Students can also be 17 if they have already graduated high school.

#### THINGS TO CONSIDER BEFORE APPLYING

#### **Entrance Qualifications**

Acceptance into the School of Leadership will be determined by your application, transcripts, references, an interview, and the prayerful consideration of our pastoral team.

### **Timing**

Three main factors contribute toward determining whether this is the right time for you to be a student:

- 1. Spiritual Authority: We want to know that the spiritual authorities in your life (parents, pastors, and mentors) all agree that this is the right training environment for you at this time.
- 2. Personal Life: Spiritual maturity and preparedness are key factors in determining your entrance into this program. In order to be considered for acceptance, your commitment to spiritual disciplines and involvement in a local church over the past six months will be examined.

3. Finances: You must demonstrate financial stability in order to be considered as a student.

### 2. Request Official Transcripts

- School of Leadership students are expected to be high school graduates or have successfully completed the High School Equivalency Exam (GED) prior to enrollment.
   In order to be accepted as a student, you must submit an official sealed high school, GED, or college transcript to our offices along with your application.

• If you have completed multiple schools, we only need the transcript form your most recent schooling (high school or college).

### 3. Admission Interview

- Once all materials have been received and reviewed, you will be contacted for a
  personal interview. For applicants who live in the area, we require an in-person
  interview. Out-of-state/country applicants will be permitted to hold a phone interview.
- Our staff will prayerfully consider each applicant before a decision is made regarding your application.
